It was 1968. I was 16, and there was a Rotary exchange student from Sweden named Amy Yngve at our high school. She was fun, smart and cute! We became friends and she challenged me to consider becoming an exchange student with Rotary. Back then it was very competitive process. But soon enough I was accepted into the program for Sweden, my first choice!

My host city in Sweden was Falun, Amy's hometown. It was about 3.5 hours from Stockholm. Amy was a great help in my adjustment and we remain friends to this day. Although the first several months were difficult --especially learning Swedish and feeling lonely -- I soon developed friendships, especially with one guy named Olle Ahlmark. We became great friends and he was responsible for my year being so successful. While in Sweden, I had three great host families and although I have lost all of my host "parents," I remain in close contact with my Swedish siblings. Eight have been to visit me in Clarion.

Over the years Olle and I have seen each other many times. Both of our families, including seven children, once traveled west for two weeks together. Recently, along with our spouses, we spent a week together traveling to New York City, to Pittsburgh for an Eagles concert, and we had a wonderful time with an Amish family for dinner in Knox.

We have hosted five wonderful exchange students and have thoroughly enjoyed it. In addition, our oldest son and daughter were Rotary exchange students to Venezuela and Argentina. Those experiences have profoundly changed their lives.

I joined Rotary after graduating from college in 1977, and have enjoyed the friendships and service to the community over the years. I am so proud to have been a very small part in eradicating polio and bringing fresh water to so many in need.

Rotary is what you make it. For me, it has been one of the greatest blessings in my life.

District Governor Nominations for 2021-2022

All District 7280 clubs are invited to submit District Governor nominations for the 2021 – 2022 Rotary year by Friday, August 17, 2018. Information shall be submitted in the form of a resolution adopted at a regular meeting of the club naming a candidate. The resolution shall be certified by the club secretary. Also, any club may suggest a candidate who is a member of another club, so long as the suggesting club first obtains the concurrence of the candidate's club.

The candidate must have been a Rotarian for seven years and served a full year as a club president. The candidate must agree in writing to having their name submitted. The two documents need to be submitted together and mailed to 2018-19 DG M. Scott Bayline via US mail at 412 Hillside Ave, Port Allegany, PA 16743.

In accordance with District and Rotary International By-Laws, ONLY club-suggested candidates are eligible to challenge the Nominating Committee's Decision.
